Program Board: Discussion meeting was held yesterday. The plan is to remake the mandatory courses for D based on last year's workshop. That's why some problematic courses will not be changed much for now.

The exams will overall be moved more towards oral exams to prevent LLMs from cheating/circumventing the intended lessons from the exam. The HP will be moved from labs to the oral

exam.

Finished Courses §6 Science for engineers (3rd year C), CEQ-meeting: The second ti-

me the course has been held, with a lot of feedback coming in. Course Administrator has a positive attitude towards AI, a posi-

tion which is not shared by higher-ups.

§7 Ongoing Courses

• C1:

Programming course: The pace has increased, but no complaints have been raised.

• D1:

Last week Björn spent a lot of time to clarify that lab attendance is mandatory, even if there is not mandatory presentation. Some people were unsure why this was the case. One slot can be missed, and still finishing the course.

• C2:

Communication systems: Were supposed to have a seminar which was changed to a feedback session for the course. The course administrator took notes and seemed receptive to the criticism of the schedule. Next year he will follow the policies more correctly.

-Follow-up on C2 having many group courses: Next year the program board will work towards having the same group in all three courses to make scheduling better.

• D2:

OMD: So far, we haven't gotten the repository for the excel project, which is used for handing in. Christian said he would upload it, once everyone had uploaded to the previous repository.

Digitalteknik: Will have a test exam to see if lockdown browser and all the tools work. (Have had or will have?)

• C3:

No one present.

• D3:

Automatic Control: After emailing about the control questions being inconsistent at the labs, the TAs no longer ask control questions.

• VR/AR:

Everything is going well. Since you don't have to attend the labs, the schedule is flexible.

WLSI: Same issues as previously, groups are randomly assigned. There was meant to be a lab session according to the schedule,

yet none was held.

CEQ form: Please take a look at the proposal posted in discord.

SRX: AI - According to LTH, students who go to labs on time might be using AI to pass, which is why they are more likely to fail the exam. The union is against the proposal to remove all HP from labs, yet it seems to be passing. The union believes that people who pass labs on time but not the exam do so because they need help from TAs and therefore pass on time with their help. It also sends strange signs to say that LTH expects people to use AI and encourages people not to work without AI. Also complicates for people with CSN and AF Bostäder. The process of removing HP from labs has started slowly, the courses affected are PGK in Python and PFK.
